The Leer Gi School has been operating for five months. The staff has learned to work well together, and we have seen the Lord create a wonderful atmosphere for educating children. Parents have also come to show us a great deal of confidence, asking us for prayer for a variety of needs.

The Lord has given us a very favorable relationship with local authorities. The school was recently paid a surprise visit from the regional academic inspector, who said it was by far the best school in the region.

The school currently has 3 preschool levels. In the Fall of 2009 we will be opening the first grade school class. Because most children do not attend preschool, we are expecting an increased enrollment with the addition of the primary school levels.
